


There were 20 apples growing on a tree and 14 fell off. How many were still left on the tree?

Estimate and measure the length of the pencil using different uniform materials.




Unit of Measurement	Estimate	Measurement



Make a connection between the text and either yourself, the world or another book it reminds you of. Complete the making text connections worksheet.











